

Meet Erika



We are excited about this partnership, as menstruation is the biggest cause of girls 11-18 missing school, and we believe that no girl's education should ever be set back because of reasons that are beyond her control. Second MGR Installation in Mali

Last week we installed our third-ever merry-go-round outside of Ghana, in Fanterela, Mali. We are excited to have been able to work with Empower Mali to bring light to even more children, and to enable 245 more students to extend their learning outside of school! Empower Playgrounds is a natural partner with Empower Mali (it's in the name!), which has made it its goal to bring education, healthcare and clean water to all of Mali. Their work complements much of what we do in Ghana--in the past Empower Mali has provided schools with tablets for learning, and partnered with American organizations to provide students with scholarships for higher education.

STEM Activity Day

We hosted African STEM Activity Day on June 2, see the photos to the left! Attendees were able to play with the very same science kits that we send to Ghanaian students, experience a VR set, and get an exclusive look at EPI's latest projects. We were happy to have Bryce Hixon from Loose in the Lab demonstrate how a science experiment on creating foam and what it can used for. We also had a representative from Origin, a company that creates sustainable glass waterbottles, who presented on the importance of clean water. Each child left with a banner, bracelets, and a knowledge of how science and technology can change the world.
