Empower Playgrounds has been providing lanterns to schools in Ghana for about 15 years. Most schools we work with have had lanterns for 10 years. Primary school in Ghana are K-6 with Junior High adding 7-9. That is the required level of schooling in Ghana. The government is working hard to add High School (10-12) to the requirement, but that requires building many more schools and educating a lot more teachers. It is taking time and money and is very slow to arrive in rural areas.

Our team in Ghana has been capturing stories of children in the schools we support. It has been very satisfying to learn that most of these students have had lanterns and evening lantern study groups for their entire educational experience. I had not stopped to think about that. This generation has an important advantage that never existed in the rural villages before. Or more accurately, have not had a big education disadvantage that has limited previous generations. We are focused on maintaining the progress.

LIGHTS CONTINUE TO SHINE

This year one of the challenges we have faced is getting lanterns back into the schools. Many lanterns had issues not being well used for almost a year. Our team in Ghana has been hard at work ensuring that each school has the lanterns they need and that they are charging properly.

Isaac, our country director and resident engineer, took the break from school to configure a new charging station for the lanterns. This new station allows more lanterns to be charged at the same time.

While on a visit to Ghana we were able to stop by Bomigo village and see the lanterns in action. You can see a group of students gathered together under the light of the lantern. This village doesn't have electricity and has greatly benefited from our lanterns. Thanks to the Thorson family who donated the money for a Merry-go-round and lanterns. This village is now thriving.



COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY

Did you know that in order to get into high school in Ghana you must pass a country wide exam? On that exam there are questions about science, English, math and computers. Reading through that list of subjects I am sure you didn't think much of it. Now I want you to think about the computer section again.

Most students in rural Ghana have not had access to a computer. If they are lucky to have a teacher bring in their personal computer they can learn and see it. However, many students learn about computer theory from a book.

During our visit to the Bahankra school we observed the Computer Teacher showing the children what a Word Document looks like by drawing it on the chalk board.

Our goal is to help improve access to computers for our rural villages. We hope to put more computer labs that include internet access at many of our schools. Having access to this type of learning would help these rural students the most.





BOREHOLES

Boreholes continue to be one of our favorite things to do. In 2021 we were able to bring clean water to 5 more villages. Bringing clean water to a village will never get old. It doesn't matter how old you are, faces light up from youngest up to the oldest when clean water comes to their village.

Our focus is always on the children and how we can enhance their educational opportunities. We believe that bringing clean water to villages near our schools will help the children in many ways. Bringing clean water not only helps prevent water bourne diseases, but it also helps children make it to school on time. Children are often the ones who are fetching the water for their families. Sometimes the path to get water is long and dangerous. This is why bringing clean water is so important for our school children.

DAYS FOR GIRLS KITS

This year we will able to reach 667 girls and distribute resusable feminine hygine kits to those in need.

Educating these girls on the importance of health and taking care of themselves properly has been an incredibly important mission for us at EPI. Reusable kits allow girls to spend money on other things such as school books, school uniforms or food for themselves or families.

In addition to saving the family money and resources these kits allow girls to stay in school. Girls who stay in school are able to keep up with their peers and are more likely to pass their exams and continue their education.









